## Easter in Castlemaine

12 Bennelong members travelled to Castlemaine for Easter this year. The orienteering areas were of a high standard with Day 1 in typical Victorian Spur/gully terrain and Day 2 and 3 in complex goldmining terrain at the site of the 1985 World Championships. Some of the more experienced members remembered watching the World Championship Relays at the very same assembly area used for Day 2 and 3. They were able to point out where various control sites were situated during the relays and where different teams including the Australian women's team came to grief.

Our most successful member was Eric Morris with a highly creditable 2nd in M21E, this result will give Eric a very good chance of making this year's Australian team for the World Championships in Denmark. Eric was consistent throughout, with places between 3rd and 5th on all 4 days.

No other member gained a place at Easter, but I managed to throw it all away after leading into the last day. I was very disappointed with my technique in losing 12 minutes at the first control on day 3, this brought me down to earth and back into 7th place.

Quite the opposite was Alexander Stollznow. Alexander has missed a lot of orienteering lately and was a bit rusty. At Easter he brushed the cobwebs aside with marked improvements each day, 23rd on Day 1, 13th on Day 2 and 5th on Day 3. We hope to see more of you this year Alexander.

Gordon Wilson like me had 1 off day which put him out of the placings, he was 3rd on Day 1 and 2nd on Day 3 but the 13th on Day 2 made it hard to keep in the placings. Gordon finished 5th overall. Steve Flick was 8th in the same grade (M55A) and a bit off his usual consistent self.

Also in 8th position was Melvyn Cox with steady but unspectacular runs on each day in M50A.

Kathy Cox just missed a place in W45AS with a good 2nd on Day 3 in the very technical terrain to bring her up to 4th place.

Cheryl Bluett also had a great run on Day 3 with a 3rd placing in W45B, but she was too far off the pace on the previous 2 days and finished in 15th place.

Wayne Pepper finished 5th in M35AS, his 3rd day was also his best with a 4th placing on the day.

Rob Spry finished 12th overall in M45AS and like Wayne was best on Day 3 with a 7th placing.

John Porter finished in 11th spot in M65A, while grandson Sebastian finished 9th in M10.

I enjoyed the weekend despite my poor form on day 3, the weather made me appreciate Sydney even more. We arrived at the camping ground at Harcourt in pouring rain and got our tent soaked inside as we were erecting it. Once the rain stopped the cold set in, we had frost on the oval on the last 2 mornings. It was lovely to arrive back in Sydney after Easter to beautiful warm nights after freezing in our tent over Easter.

Most work was needed on the section around Killarney Heights, where a lot of the track seems to be unused from one NOSH to the next.
